Happy May, the month of honor. This month is the month to honor our mothers and those that gave the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom.



Pineapple Upside Down Cake

- 1 can pineapple rings (drain and save juice for cake mix)
- 1 jar maraschino cherries
- 1 cup brown sugar, packed
- 1 stick butter
- 1 box yellow cake mix (plus ingredients for cake)

Preheat oven to 325°. Put stick of butter in center of pan and put in oven to melt. After it melts, spread evenly. Cover bottom of pan with pineapple rings followed by cherries. Sprinkle brown sugar over all.

Mix cake mix as directed, using reserved pineapple juice instead of water. Pour cake batter over the top of the pineapple, sugar and cherries. Spread evenly.

Bake for about 50 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.




Cracker Pizzas

Saltine crackers
Tomato sauce / spaghetti sauce
Mozzarella cheese, shredded
Pepperonis or other toppings

Preheat oven to 400°. Line a cookie sheet with saltine crackers. Be sure the crackers are flat. Add a dollop of sauce to each cracker, sprinkle cheese and add additional toppings.

Bake for 8-10 minutes or until cheese is melted and bubbly. Let cool. Enjoy!



5-Ingredient Ground Beef Casserole

1 ½ to 2 pounds ground beef
10.5 ounce can cream of mushroom soup
10.5 ounce can cheddar cheese soup
3 cups cubed frozen potatoes
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese (divided)
Salt and pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 350°. Cook ground beef, drain the grease, and add to a large mixing bowl.

Add the can of cream of mushroom and cheddar cheese soup to the bowl.

Add the frozen cubed potatoes to the bowl. Add ½ cup of the shredded cheddar cheese to the bowl.

Add a pinch of salt and pepper and mix everything together.

Pour into a greased 9" x 13" casserole dish and sprinkle the remainder of the shredded cheese on top. Cover with tin foil. Bake for 30 minutes, and carefully remove the tin foil. Bake for 30 more minutes.




Just for Fun!

Tribute to Judy




I remember how she always greeted you with, "Well hello there." She truly loved her family. I never saw a mother and grandmother who loved and was so close to her family.


Solution for Picnic Time Word Search

Word Search Puzzle




